





Circuit De Spa


Surface: Tarmac/Gravel Direction: Anticlockwise Circuit Length: 0.91M




Knockhill

Circuit Length: 1.10M




Lydden Hill

The European championship from 1989 to 1995, being third in championship for two years, and then the world championship with a best finish of 4th place. Finally, Isle of Man TT from 1979 to 1992.

The Agenda for the meeting sent out with the Notice of AGM was followed and the following business took place:-

- 1) The previous minutes were not available but have been prepared and will be circulated as soon as possible.
- 2) The Chairman Dave Bellerby gave his report. He welcomed members to the meeting and said it had been a memorable year in so many ways. The AGM should have taken place in February at the awards night as usual but had been postponed until now due to Covid 19 restrictions. The good news was that the circuit had now been granted planning permission for an extensive development programme and had secured the British Championship title rights.

It was essential that the Club developed alongside the circuit and it was time for some new people to take the Club to the next level. As a result the Chairman was not standing for re-election. He thanked everyone for their support and wished his successor and the new committee the best of luck.

- 3) The Treasurers report was unfortunately not available today but will be circulated to members as soon as it is available.
- 4) There was no separate Secretary's report today as all matters will be covered elsewhere in the meeting and follow up reports.
- 5) Dave Bellerby was proposed as Honorary President by Pat Doran and elected unanimously.
- 6) The Chairman confirmed that all committee positions automatically end at the AGM and the following committee elections took place:-

Chairman - Tristan Ovenden, proposed Simone Cornish, unanimous. Tristan thanked everyone for putting their trust in him and said it was an honour to chair them Club.

Treasurer - Leah De Silva, proposed Simone Cornish, unanimous.

Secretary - Simone Cornish, proposed Ann Richardson, unanimous.

Competition Secretary - Josh Bennett, proposed Simone Cornish, unanimous.

Safeguarding Officer. It was noted that Simone Cornish had successfully completed the Motorsport UK course and therefore already held this position.

Chief Marshal - Andrew Elliott, proposed Simone Cornish, unanimous.

Additional Committee member - Keenan Tait, proposed Simone Cornish, unanimous.

- 7) The Motorsport UK Safeguarding Policy was formally adopted. Unanimous
- 8) The Motorsport UK Privacy Policy was formally adopted. Unanimous
- 9) The Motorsport UK Social Media Policy was formally adopted. Unanimous
- 10) It was agreed in principle to change the club name to ensure that it is not confused either the business of the circuit. This would now be followed up. Unanimous
- 11) it was agreed in principle that their may well be benefits, in particular more legal protection for the club in becoming a limited company. This would also now be followed up. Unanimous
- 12) Annual subscriptions; these were set at £30 for competitors and £15 for affiliate membership. Unanimous
- 13) AOB agree that if possible the AGM should be arranged for the awards dinner. A provisional date has been set for end January 2021.
